Master Articulation Agreement Between Shenandoah University And Lord Fairfax Community College

Purpose

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to assist students at various levels of higher education to achieve their educational goals in an efficient and timely way. This purpose can be achieved through the coordination between the two institutions of transfer policies, enhanced advising and acceptance of approved credits to satisfy requirements at the partner institution.

Composition of the Agreement

This agreement is composed of the following parts:

- A. General provisions
- B. Acceptance of LFCC Degrees
- C. Course Equivalencies Guide

Date of Implementation: September, 2005

A. General Provisions

This articulation agreement between Shenandoah University (SU) and Lord Fairfax Community College (LFCC) will facilitate transfer of students from LFCC to SU. These provisions are intended as a guide. However, the respective catalogs in force at any particular time remain the basic documents governing transfer policies.

The following stipulations also apply:

1. Students who have earned an Associate of Arts and Sciences degree which represents a university-parallel curriculum from LFCC are considered to have satisfied the General Education requirements of SU. Student completing the Associate in Applied Science degree will not be deemed to have completed the SU General Education requirements; their LFCC course-work will be evaluated on a course by course basis.

Transfer students under this agreement should be aware that even though the general education requirements may be met, SU academic programs have individual core and major requirements that must still be fulfilled. This may result in the student having to complete hours beyond the 120 credit minimum at SU

2. LFCC students who have not completed a degree at LFCC but still desire to transfer to SU will have their transcripts evaluated on a course by course basis using the current edition of the SU/LFCC Course Equivalency Guide. For acceptance in transfer, each course grade must be a C- or better. Remedial, developmental, and/or vocational courses (e.g. horticulture, clerical studies, engineering technology, etc.) will not be counted for academic credit in transfer.

Lower level (100, 200) will not normally be transferred for upper division (300, 400) credit. Students may appeal for upper division credit, with the decision on whether or not to grant upper division credit based on the credentials of the course instructor and the course content. The student appealing the course must provide background on the instructor and a copy of the course syllabus.

3. Students will not be required to repeat courses that have been satisfactorily completed at LFCC excepting cases
 - a. where special restrictions apply to all students
 - b. where the scope of a prerequisite course does not satisfy professional certification
 - c. in certain science courses which were taken ten or more years ago. In this case, if the SU science faculty determines that the student's preparation for upper division course work is not appropriately up to date; the student may be required to complete additional work in preparation for advanced level courses.
4. SU graduation requirements in effect at the date of the student's admission to LFCC will be used in certifying the student for graduation from SU provided that the student matriculates at SU within three years of admission to LFCC.

Procedures

As part of this agreement, SU and LFCC will develop a procedure whereby they will inform each other, in a timely manner, of any changes in curricula, policies, or procedures that might affect this agreement or its implementation. This coordination is particularly important in basic science courses which serve as prerequisites for professional courses where SU assumes responsibility for overall quality of instruction under accreditation standards.

In addition, institutional representatives will meet every two years to review this agreement and discuss any problems of articulation that may arise. The institutions are also encouraged to develop program-to-program subsidiary agreements that detail preferred courses for specific majors.

Amendment and Term of Effect

This agreement may be amended as needed for specific program articulations without affecting the currency of the master agreement. The Course Equivalency Guide may be amended as needed.

This master agreement will remain in effect until terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice will be effective only if given 180 days prior to the intended date of termination. In the event that this agreement is terminated, the terms of agreement contained herein will remain in effect for a maximum of four years.

B. Acceptance of LFCC Degrees

College of Arts and Sciences

Students completing LFCC degrees will meet College of Arts and Sciences core requirements under the same terms as those spelled out in the General Provisions above (A.1.) with the exception of the foreign language competency requirement. LFCC transfer students will be required to meet that requirement in order to graduate from SU. Completion of American Sign Language through the LFCC ASL 202 American Sign Language IV level will be accepted as having met the SU language competency requirement.

Conservatory of Music

LFCC students seeking admission to the Conservatory of Music will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Health Professions

Transfer of LFCC students to health profession programs is governed by separate articulated transfer programs.

PURPOSE

To establish guidelines for pre-admittance into the Bernard J. Dunn School of Pharmacy for students who have earned an Associate of Arts and Sciences in Science degree at Lord Fairfax Community College who expect to ultimately seek a Doctor of Pharmacy degree.

ELEMENTS OF THE AGREEMENT

A. PRIORITY STATUS

Priority status will be given to students who have earned an Associate in Arts and Sciences in Science (AA&S) degree from Lord Fairfax Community College (LFCC) and who meet the following criteria:

1. AA&S in Science degree with all pre-requisites;
2. Pharmacy Admission Test (PCAT) taken no later than October with a composite percentage score of 70 or greater;
3. Overall GPA of 3.25 on a 4.0 grading scale;
4. Completed application to School of Pharmacy by February 1 deadline.
5. Interview with and letter of recommendation from the Dean of the School of Pharmacy or his designee;
6. Two favorable letters of recommendation from faculty members at Lord Fairfax Community College;
7. One letter of support from a healthcare provider.

B. BENEFITS TO AA&S DEGREE GRADUATES FROM LFCC

All Associate in Science degree graduates from LFCC who have been admitted into the LFCC pre-pharmacy program will receive admissions priority.

1. The Bernard J. Dunn School of Pharmacy will guarantee two (2) seats in the incoming class each year for LFCC AA&S in Science degree graduates who meet priority status criteria listed above.
2. Associate in Science degree graduates from LFCC will be exempt from the standard Bernard J. Dunn School of Pharmacy interview process. Qualifying students will only interview with the Dean of the Pharmacy School or his designee during the spring semester prior to enrollment.
3. Associate in Science degree graduates from LFCC will be allowed to submit a Shenandoah University graduate paper application, rather than applying via PharmCAS.
